In remote, mountainous villages with poor roads and little to no medical care, giving birth is often dangerous for the mother and child. After hours of grueling labor at home, 19-year-old Sughra was making little progress, while her condition was rapidly deteriorating.

It took her family two agonizing hours to reach the nearest medical facility—a clinic you helped fund. The staff worked for three arduous hours to deliver the baby. But the labor had taken a toll. The baby had swallowed amniotic fluid and wasn't able to breathe. He could have died.

He didn't. He and his mother survived because you met them in their greatest moment of need. Thank you for bringing comfort and healing.

Hunger can come from anywhere—famine, illness, or bad luck can plunge families into crisis. Floods destroyed the fields in Iwan's village and made the fishing grounds too turbulent. While trying to fish and provide for his family, Iwan fell and suffered a stroke. Suddenly he could not work or feed his wife and daughter. Then you came to the rescue. Iwan was one of the 163,612 people who received food assistance last year. God's heart breaks for the hungry and sends rescue through compassionate, generous hearts like yours.






