



WEEK 1: Clean Water



"I will pour out water on the thirsty land. I will make streams flow on the dry ground. I will pour out my Spirit on your children. I will pour out my blessing on their children after them." — Isaiah 44:3



Sunday – There's nothing better than an ice-cold drink of water on a hot day. Whether you drink it from a bottle, a water fountain, or the sink in your house, you probably don't have much trouble finding plenty of clean water to drink. But some kids aren't so lucky. In some poor places in the world, kids have to walk miles to find clean water. But there's good news! We can help by praying for people without clean water.

Shaoib's Story:

Did you know that when you help other people, you honor God?

BGR friends did just that when they helped pay for two brand-new water pumps for Shaoib's village. Shaoib is a farmer who doesn't make much money. He lives on someone else's land and isn't close to any hospitals or schools and the only source of water he and his neighbors had was a dirty pond.

The water made so many boys and girls sick. But when the new pumps were installed, Shaoib, his four children and the whole village finally had clean water for the first time!

You can honor God by thanking Him for this miracle! Thank Him for giving Shaoib the joy and peace of mind as he watches his family drink clean water that can't hurt them.





Monday – Can you imagine walking a mile in the heat or freezing cold to get water? Pray that water wells will be built in villages close to people's homes, so kids don't have to walk for it.

Tuesday – We use water to take baths, brush our teeth, wash our hands, and more! Pray that kids will find safe water so they can be clean and healthy.

Wednesday – Pray that churches in the United States will understand how many families around the world need clean water and want to help by building wells to keep kids clean and safe.

Thursday – Water filters help make dirty water clean. BGR partners give them to kids in schools in Southeast Asia. Pray they can help kids who can't get to clean water.

Friday – Jesus said that He is the Living Water. Pray that kids will find water to drink to keep their bodies healthy and Living Water for their hearts and lives.

Saturday – Did you learn anything new this week?

- Tell a friend about Shaoib's story. Put the story on your refrigerator to remember how God provided for Shaoib's family!
- Every time you drink a cup of water, say a quick prayer for kids without clean water. Challenge your friends and family to pray with you!



WEEK 2: Healthy Kids





"Beloved, I pray that all may go well with you and that you may be in good health, as it goes well with your soul." – 3 John 1:2



Sunday – Being sick is no fun! When you are, does your mom give you medicine? Do you stay home from school and go to the doctor? What if you didn't have medicine or the doctor was way far away? It would sure be a lot harder to get better, wouldn't it? Organizations like BGR help people around the world get medicine and see the doctors they need.

Judith's Story:





Judith now had no parents and no friends. She was so sad and lonely.

But, God is a father to people who don't have one. He used Baptist Global Response to help Judith.

A BGR program close to her home gave Judith and 44 other orphans clothes, school supplies, and medicine. A doctor was able to help Judith find out why her hair was so thin and gave her medication that made her all better. As BGR partners showed her love, other people did too—including her grandmother. She even got to go back to school!

Judith's life is so much happier now, but she still has a long way to go. Pray she knows God loves her.





Monday – Lots of kids around the world don't have good doctors and no way to get to them. Pray that these kids can find the medicine and the care they need when they are sick.

Tuesday – Some kids are so sick they have to miss school. Pray that doctors can help them get better and they can get back to learning!

Wednesday – Pray for babies who are sick because their moms didn't have healthy food to eat when they were in her tummy. Pray for BGR partners who are helping provide good, healthy food for moms and babies.

Thursday – Some kids are sick and can't do all the things other kids can. They might be lonely. Pray that they would feel the love of God wrap around them like a big hug.

Friday – Jesus loves everyone even if they are sick. He wants everyone to get better—their bodies and their hearts. Pray kids without doctors and medicine will feel the love of Jesus.

Saturday – Did you learn anything new this week?

- Tell a friend about Judith's story. Put the story on your refrigerator to remember how God provided for Judith!
- There may be a clinic in your city for people who don't have enough money to pay for doctors.

 Ask your parents help you call the clinic and find out if they need any medicine. Then, you can get the medicine and give it to them so they can help more people.



WEEK 3: Education



"And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding..." — Colossians 1:9



Sunday – There are probably days when you don't want to go to school, but your parents make you anyway. But did you know that lots of kids who do want to go can't because it costs too much money? Some of these kids have to work instead of going to school, and some don't live close enough to one. Thank God that you can learn and pray that other kids will get to go to school, so when they grow up, they can get good jobs.

Trust's Story:

Trust is 23-years old and a college student who loves to study!

That may not sound like much fun for lots of people, but Trust knows how lucky he is to be able to go to school. Lots of people in his country never get the chance to go to college because it costs too much. In fact, there wasn't much of a chance for Trust to ever go to college before nice people like you helped him pay for it.

Trust and his family didn't have a lot of money growing up. When his dad died, his mom worked really hard to make enough money to take care of Trust and his three sisters and give them an education, but she still needed help. A group of Christians in their area gave their family money for school fees and supplies and food to keep them healthy.

"This assistance came through during a time of great need," Trust says.

Trust and his family never had an easy life, but his future will be so much better because people like you helped him go to school and learn—just like you and your friends!

No wonder he loves to study! Thank God for giving Trust hope even when things were hard. Pray Trust would experience and know the love of Christ each day in school.





Monday – Not every kid learns how to read and write. Pray that very poor kids starting kindergarten will have the help they need so they can learn too!

Tuesday – Some kids can't go to school because they have to work to help make money for their family. Pray that these kids will somehow get to go to school and learn the things they need.

Wednesday – English can help kids get out of tough situations. Pray that boys studying English in an orphanage in Central Asia will learn the language and other life skills that will help them when they get older.

Thursday – In lots of countries, school costs a lot. Pray for kids to have enough money for books, supplies, uniforms, and tuition to good schools in their villages to continue their education.

Friday – As kids just like you study hard, pray that they will also learn that Jesus loves them.

Saturday - Did you learn anything new this week?

WEEK 4: Refugees










"Don't forget to do good. Don't forget to share with others. God is pleased with those kinds of offerings." – Hebrews 13:16



Sunday – Do you ever play outside with other kids in your neighborhood? Some kids can't do fun things like that because their towns aren't safe. There might be a war nearby or people who don't like them because of what they believe. Many times, these kids have to leave their homes forever just to be safe. Can you imagine how scary it would be to start over in a new city? Families who have to do this are called refugees.





It's important to feel safe, especially when you're far away from home.

Dikembe and his seven brothers and sisters didn't feel safe for a long time after their family had to leave their house and move far away to get out of danger. Their mom and dad couldn't find jobs, and they hardly have any money. It was scary for all of them!

But friends like you have made them feel better and safer by helping to give them blankets. Now, every night, they can snuggle deep inside their fuzzy blankets and feel the safety and comfort of God's love.

Praise the Lord that Dikembe found comfort, and pray for other children around the world who are refugees.





Monday – Pray for refugee children as they start at a new school. Many don't know the language the teachers use and don't yet speak or read it very well.

Tuesday – Pray that refugee children will be able to study and learn without being afraid that something bad might happen.

Wednesday – Pray for refugee children who have to stay inside in one room all day long because it's not safe to go out and play. Ask God to give them fun ways to pass the day inside.

Thursday – Pray that refugee children will get to do fun things like sports, art, music, and other things kids love to do.

Friday – Sometimes, it's hard to admit you're scared or sad. Pray that refugee children will know how to tell others when they are sad, lonely, or afraid and that they would get the help they need.

Saturday – Did you learn anything new this week?

- There might be refugees in your own school!
